Introduction and rationale

The results of the survey on communication needs carried out in January 2017 demonstrated the need for a SCAR newsletter.

In this context, the CASA management group decided to publish a SCAR newsletter twice a year. WP4 developed the layout of the newsletter.

The target group of the newsletters is all SCAR members, the members of all SCAR groups, other interested stakeholders and all Member States which are very involved in SCAR activities.

This report corresponds to the Deliverable D.4.19 of the CASA CSA project.



Content of the newsletter

The outline for the newsletters includes three sections: activities of each of the working groups during the period; information on CASA's specific contributions to the SCAR activities, and general information useful to the SCAR community. The SCAR community mainly relates to societal challenge (SC) 2 of H2020 with a focus on research and innovation.

Furthermore, a European calendar was included covering the most important events in Europe dealing with research and innovation in the SC2 of H2020 when inputs were provided by SCAR members.

Newsletter issuing process

The process for issuing each newsletter was set up with support from all the CASA consortium partners.

About two months before issuing the newsletter, the WP4 leader sent emails to all SCAR chairs and co-chairs and EC representatives in charge of the SCAR SWG and CWG and the Foresight Group requesting articles related to the activities of their working groups (WGs) since the last newsletter issue. The CASA management group, as well as other members of the CASA consortium actively involved in SCAR SWG and CWG were informed.

This planning was organised to ensure that every SCAR SWG and CWG could contribute to the newsletter.

Several reminders were sent in order to ensure the maximum number of contribution.

As all persons contributing to SCAR have other duties, the deadlines for receiving articles were extended on many occasions. It is worth noting that, due to the lack of availability of chairs and co-chairs, several members of CASA had to draft the SCAR SWG and CWG articles in order to facilitate the reporting on the activities of the groups. These articles were always submitted for approval by chairs and co-co-chairs prior to publication.

The text of all compiled articles was sent to the partner INIAV two weeks before the publication for preparing an attractive and readable layout. INIAV designed similar but different layouts for each issue of the newsletter. Once a first final draft was available, it was sent to the CASA management group for proofreading as well as for comments about layout and graphics.



Finally, the newsletter was published on the SCAR website and an announcement was made to all SCAR chairs and co-chairs and to the EC representatives. Thanks to the help of SCAR Secretariat, all the SCAR delegates were informed.

The newsletter was also disseminated to the persons who subscribed to it on the SCAR website.

Summary of newsletter issues

In general publication was aimed to be immediately prior to a SCAR plenary.

The first newsletter was published in June 2017 before the SCAR Plenary meeting which took place on 21st June 2017.

The second SCAR newsletter was published in November 2017 before the SCAR Plenary meeting which took place on 4th and 5th December 2017 in Tallinn Estonia.

The third newsletter was published on 25th June 2018, accordingly to the plan, before the SCAR plenary meeting in June 2018.

The fourth newsletter was published 3rd December 2018.

The fifth newsletter was published 7th June 2019.

All issues of the newsletter are hosted on the <u>SCAR website</u> and were provided as documents on CIRCABC prior to the SCAR plenary meetings.



Lessons learnt

"Based on the survey carried out by CASA CSA (see CASA CSA report deliverable D3.10), the vast majority perceives the newsletter as important or very important. Therefore, it can be assumed that the newsletter proved to be useful to all SCAR delegates and experts to be informed about the activities of all groups".

Some important issues are listed below for consideration if the SCAR newsletter is to continue after the completion of the CASA project on 31st August 2019. This may help a smooth and possibly improved follow up.

- Working on a new issue requires material and articles written by as many SCAR working groups as possible. Until now, it mainly relied on the contribution of the SCAR chairs and co-chairs and the CASA members. Very often, in order to save time, the CASA team pre-drafted a text submitted for improvements and approval by the SCAR groups.
- Releasing a newsletter issue is a time consuming activity mainly because, due to other duties, the SCAR groups are very slow to reply and often they cannot dedicate sufficient time to draft more than short articles other than the ones concerning the meetings they had. Therefore, planning is an important part of the task and external support is required.

Recommendations

- As soon as the CASA CSA ends, there will be the need for a replacement to continue editing the newsletter. It is recommended that a small communication "taskforce" is created in each SCAR WG: it would be responsible for monitoring events and drafting short articles.
- As discussed during the SCAR conference in June 2019, in order to enhance the visibility of SCAR, it is important to keep a high standard in the layout of the newsletter. The CASA CSA had the chance to benefit from the help of a professional graphic designer who made an excellent job in making the newsletter appealing. These skills will have to be considered.
- The contents of the newsletter could include more reflection articles than has been the case. Despite several requests, SCAR groups had difficulty in submitting articles on their work and reports. This could constitute an improvement to enhance the SCAR visibility and communication.
- As the newsletter mainly targets SCAR members and policy makers, an editorial article by the SCAR Steering Group (SG) group with the help the secretariat would certainly constitute a strong added value.
