

► Future-proofing food systems through increasing the impact from Research & Innovation



To contribute to the transformation of FNS-related R&I by providing a transformative network and instruments for the adoption of a food systems and RRI approach to R&I.

Policy labs: an important part of the Fit4Food2030 transformative network

EU Think Tank: linking the EC and member states and connecting towards global policy objectives



Policy Labs: to align R&I policies and programmes



City labs: to engage with the local stakeholders (studencts, professionals, educators, young people)

Goal, method and potential outcomes

'In the policy labs, European countries and regions aim to maximise the impact of Research and Innovation on future-proofing their food system. The labs bring together national and regional stakeholders from the various areas of the food system, making a point of **including people who are usually not involved** in policy discussions. In a series of interactive meetings over the course of the project, they **analyse t**he current food system and related R&I landscape, define **knowledge gaps and opportunities** and work **on innovative R&I policies**. Central aspects in this process should be a **holistic approach and Responsible Research and Innovation**. Potential outcomes could be policy briefs, methodologies or new R&I programmes.'



General steps: The Policy Lab Mantra

- What is the Food System?
 - → what does it look like in from global, European and country perspective? What are global/European/ national trends relating to or influencing the food system?
- What are the main societal challenges related to the food system in my country?
 - → what can we do something about? What are our strengths and weaknesses?
- What are the knowledge gaps and research needs to tackle these issues and make transitions possible?
 - → define through RRI, involving scientists, policy makers, industry and other stakeholders. What existing, relevant R&I agendas are there? What are the strenghts of your R&I community?
- What does this imply for R&I policy?
 - → How does the policy-research interface work in my country? What changes are needed? What outcomes do we want?
- Involving stakeholders along the way and being mindful of who you might be missing

General outline: national meetings



1st meeting: System Awareness and System Understanding

- Understanding of the food system
- Understanding of the main challenges and knowledge questions of the key players of the food systems
- Overview of existing research agendas, research programmes
- Do you miss any stakeholders?

Between 1st and 2nd meeting: work towards a draft vision (ultimate goal/impact of policy lab)

2nd meeting: Future outlook and agenda setting

- Discuss and agree upon vision
- Make an assessment of your R&I landscape → for example a SWOT analysis
- Draft a roadmap to improve the R&I landscape, to work towards your vision (or future outlook or ultimate goal)

Why?


- ▶ Better alignment and cooperation between relevant departments of the Flemish Government

- Better alignment with European policy




Why?


- → Flow of research ideas to policy level and vice versa

Phase 1: Preparation (2018)

- Preparation
 - → Assessment of existing policies, programs, actions, platforms in Flanders and Belgium
 - → Identifying relevant stakeholders
- Brainstorm session (6/2018)
 - → Platform of Agricultural research (researchers)
 - → Focus: Food and Health
- Policy vision document on Policy Lab: support of SG's and Ministers





Phase 2: First Regional event

- ▶ Kick-off meeting (5/11/2018):
 - → Community of practice
 - → Bringing together quadruple helix
 - → Identifying gaps and opportunities in R&I (in focus area)
 - → Complete our assesment of stakeholders and initiatives
- Analysing outcome of workshops:
 - → Research and innovation agenda 1.0 (RIA 1.0)
 - → 10 action lines
 - → Recommendations for policy
 - → Recommendations for science policy



Phase 3: Finetuning RIA 1.0

- Bilateral meetings specific stakeholder groups (Q2 2019)
 - Food Industry, Flander Food (cluster R&I)
 - Consumer organisations
 - Farmer associations
 - Cities
 - Universities and research institutions
 - Federal Research institution
 - Flemish Research Council and Academy
 - Funding agencies
- ▶ RIA 2.0
- SWOT Analysis on RIA



Combining two policy actions/groups


Policy group on sustainable food (informal, Dep): thinking on a Flemish Food Policy or Strategy.

Fit4Food Policy lab: thinking on a Food Research Agenda

- Decision to work together and strive for a Flemish Food Policy Strategy supported by a Research Agenda in the next Governing Period
- Elections in 2019: New government
- First preparatory steps towards the integral food policy
 - Mentioned in the coalition agreement new government 2019-2024; policy notes of the Minister of Science and Innovation and of Agriculture.
 - We, civil servants, got our **mandate** to continue on this path.








Structure of the RIA 3.0



- ▶ All ideas are clustered according to the 4 European Food 2030 themes:
 - circularity and input-efficiency
 - climate and sustainability
 - innovation and economy
 - nutrition and health.
- For each theme, a link is made to **Flemish policy objectives** and the findings from the **Flemish Science Agenda**, based on science questions from citizens.
- ▶ One or more **missions** are formulated and explained under each theme. All ideas and suggestions that emerged in the interactive sessions are listed below.
- ▶ Under **Roadmap**, the research domain prioritised by the stakeholders is presented with a proposed objective. The possible roles of the various actors within that objective are also indicated.
- ▶ Finally, per theme, reference is also made to the **research lines** already present at Flanders' FOOD and ILVO.





Phase 5: Implementation?

- Boost for the development of the Flemish Food Strategy
 - → Lead: Department of Agriculture and Fisheries
 - → Intens process: together with stakeholders, citizens, and Gov. departments to write a strategy (in which Research and Innovation is a central thread).
 - → 29/11 and 2/12/2022 the Flemish Food Strategy will be presented.
 - × Concrete deals:
 - Deal 1: Flanders as an innovative Food Hub
 - ⇒ Using smart innovation to accelerate the transition to a sustainable food ecosystem through intelligent and targeted tools
 - ⇒ research and innovation: Role for the RIA of the Fit4Food Policy Lab



Translating science into policy

Policy lab:

- → Bringing together researchers, industry, government, citizens
- → Create a research agenda
- → Inspiriation for researchers
- → Not a specific research project, not really policy-demand research/project
- → Bottom-up process from the administration (civil servants)
- → Using the momentum (new elections, Food high on the agenda in Europe)
- → Boost to the development of a Flemish Food Strategy
- → Basis for further support under deal 1 of the strategy
